The story of Split is already 17 centuries old, dating to the time the Roman Emperor Diocletian decided to build his palace right on the peninsula near the great Roman city of Salona, where he wanted to spend the last years of his life. During these 1700 years, the Palace slowly turned into a city, which to this day lures with its rich tradition, glorious history, and beauty of its natural and cultural heritage.

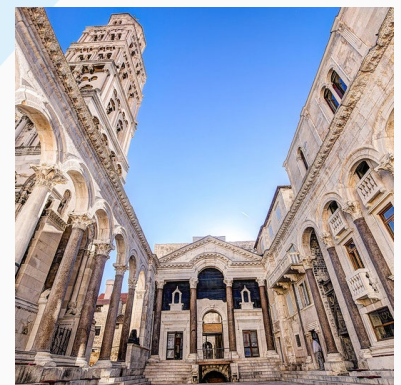
Diocletian's Palace and the entire historical core of Split have been on the World Heritage UNESCO list ever since 1979, and not only for the extraordinary preservation of the Palace, but also because the Palace and its city (or the city and its Palace, if you like) continue to live a full life.

Dive into the history of Split with a professor in a walking tour.

Visiting Diocletian's palace is great, but visiting the Palace, medieval and modern Split is even better.

Feel the history of the Roman Palace and start a journey through the center of Split, filled with the Venetian, Ottoman, and Napoleonic influence. Of course, all that with the Game of Thrones locations, interesting facts and a dash of local life and legends.

Start at the Riva promenade, see the Palace substructures, Peristyle, Vestibule, and discover the landmarks such as the Cathedral of Saint Domnius and the Golden Gate.

## SALONA – THE KLIS FORTRESS – STELLA CROATICA

**Salona** is the largest archaeological park in Croatia, whose size is attested by the monumental ramparts with towers and gates, a forum with temples, an amphitheater and cemeteries with Salonian martyrs. Salona was a town with over 60,000 inhabitants and, according to the legend, the birthplace of the Emperor Diocletian.

**The hill of Klis** is a connection between the Mount Mosor to the east and Kozjak to the west. Over history, it has been a target for many nations, from the Illyrians and the Venetians to the Ottomans who considered the port of Dalmatia an open path towards the ancient Salona and Split.

At the peak of this hill, a village was built, which the Ottomans later fortified. The well-known Klis fortress is not only a symbol of the village but also of the resistance of the united Dalmatians in their fight against the Ottomans. Today, Klis also represents a link between the sea and Zagora (the hinterland) as both the old and new roads leading towards the Croatian hinterland pass through here.

**Ethno-agro park “Stella Croatica”** is a place where you will feel all the senses and the charm of Dalmatia. Here, you can visit the olive museum and learn about the ancient method of olive oil production; you can also visit the manufacture where local delicacies are hand-made and tour the traditional family estate.

### “HIDDEN DALMATIA” VISITOR CENTER - SINJ MUSEUM OF THE SINJSKA ALKA

“Hidden Dalmatia” Visitor Center is located in the economic zone Podi-Dugopolje, next to the football stadium. It is a multimedia and educational center that interprets in a modern way the natural heritage of the Split-Dalmatia County, with an emphasis on the mountain Mosor. This space offers its visitors a multimedia and sensory experience through the VR (virtual reality) animated interpretation and expert guidance of educators.

The Town of Sinj is located in the heart of the Dalmatian hinterland, with an elevation of 320 meters, and at a 30-km distance from the Adriatic Sea. Surrounded by beautiful mountains of Kamešnica, Svilaja and Dinara, Sinj is situated at the edge of the fertile Sinjsko Polje Valley, which is invigorated by the crystal clear and cold Cetina River.

Museum of the Sinjska Alka is a place where everybody – including natives and tourists, young and old – will find something interesting and surely be inspired by a unique gem of the Croatian and global intangible cultural heritage, the value of which is even protected by UNESCO.

Each visitor will be able to experience the greatness of Alka: from the lavishly decorated original Alkar and Alkar squire uniforms, valuable equipment and weaponry, 300-year-old historical objects, to a special attraction – a life-size display of the Alka procession.

It comprehensively ties the past and the present and in its priceless value keeps the Alka identity, securing the future for generations to come.
